<p><b>My Medicare Advantage plan covers select drugs through Medicare Part B.</b></p> <p><b>What types of drugs are available? How can I get them?</b></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ All Blue Cross Medicare Advantage, Medicare Advantage PPO and BCN Advantage HMO members can get select Part B drugs, including nebulizer solutions and oral cancer medications, at their local pharmacy. The benefit began March 29 for Medicare Advantage PPO members and May 20 for BCN Advantage HMO members.</li> <li>▪ The following are types of drugs covered by Part B:             <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>– Drugs used with an item of durable medical equipment</li> <li>– Some antigens</li> <li>– Injectable osteoporosis drugs</li> <li>– Erythropoiesis-stimulating agents</li> <li>– Blood clotting factors</li> <li>– Injectable and infused drugs</li> <li>– Oral end stage renal disease drugs</li> <li>– Parenteral and enteral nutrition for intravenous and tube feeding</li> <li>– Intravenous immune globulin, or IVIG, provided in home</li> <li>– Vaccinations</li> <li>– Transplant and immunosuppressive drugs</li> </ul> </li> <li>▪ Members should show their Blue Cross or BCNA membership ID card at their local pharmacy to use this benefit. This benefit can also be used through their designated mail order pharmacy.</li> </ul>
<p><b>Where can I view the drug list?</b></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ We have placed a link on the microsite that provides basic information about Medicare Part B. Members who visit <a href="http://bcbsm.com/UAWTrust">bcbsm.com/UAWTrust</a> will be able to view the list of available drugs being offered through their plan.</li> </ul>
<p><b>What's my cost share for Medicare Part B drugs?</b></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ <b>For the General Class:</b> Medicare Part B Prescriptions drugs – in or out of network, members have a 10% coinsurance after meeting their deductible (\$245 which applies to their annual out of pocket maximum of \$630).             <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>– For certain oral anti-cancer and anti-nausea drugs, and certain immunosuppressive drugs following a Medicare covered transplant, services are covered up to 100% of approved amount.</li> </ul> </li> <li>▪ <b>For the Protected Class:</b> Coverage at 100% in or out of network on all Medicare Part B prescriptions</li> </ul>

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
