

## COVID-19 Test to Treat program coverage

The federal government's new Test to Treat program provides a one-stop location for an individual to get a COVID-19 test and, if the test is positive and he or she is eligible for treatment with an oral antiviral drug such as Paxlovid<sup>TM</sup> or Molnupiravir, the prescription can be written by a health care provider and then filled, all in the same visit.

Test to Treat locations can include:

- Federally qualified health centers
- Long-term care facilities
- Pharmacies with an on-site health clinic

Here's what you need to know about Blue Cross Blue Shield of Michigan and Blue Care Network coverage for Test to Treat providers:

- There is no member cost share associated with covered COVID-19 testing. COVID-19 testing for employment, school or public health surveillance is not covered. However, the assessment for a possible oral antiviral drug is eligible for member cost share for treatment.
- The federal government is supplying the antiviral drugs at no cost to providers. Do not bill for the cost of drugs supplied by the government.
- Health care providers should bill for the test administration and treatment assessment using the member's medical benefit.
- Pharmacies can bill for dispensing the drug using the member's pharmacy benefit.
